
For seniors, we are 14 school days (and a wake-up) from graduation.

Sporting Clays Season: Out With A Bang!

We had 19 shooters and 9 coaches participate in the sporting clays program this year. Our season began in December and ended last weekend with 6 tournaments under our belt. The highlights of the season included:

Our JV Boys Squad, Wilson Britton, Jack Burke, and Jackson Barnes, placed 2nd in the SCISA State Championship.

Madeleine Britton and Logan Scruggs received \$1000 scholarships at the South Carolina Youth Shooting Foundation's State Championship.

Clay Team won a shotgun at the South Carolina Youth Shooting Foundation's State Championship.

Carter Brazell won our team award for Consistent Improvement. Carter improved his score by 20 points from the beginning of the season with a 61 until the end with an 81. Each tournament score was better than the previous.

Wilson Britton won our team award for Most Valuable Shooter. Wilson's lowest score for the season was an 80 and the highest was a 91.

Clay Team won our team award for selling the most raffle tickets in our fundraiser. Our team sold 356 tickets through the South Carolina Youth Shooting Foundation and earned \$1424 dollars in addition to adding \$4000 to our endowment account.

We have 6 Seniors, Randall Bock, Carter Brazell, Madeleine Britton, Jack Dennis, Hayden Poston, and Logan Scruggs. 3 of these seniors made up one squad and their parents are TSA Class of 89 alumnae, James Dennis, Ashleigh Goza, and Charlie Scruggs.




